Registration Information

Please complete the Skyward online registration or attached registration form to enroll your student in summer school. Skyward login information can be obtained from Mrs. Jocham at Richfield Elementary at 262-628-1032. Registration will open February 5th for Richfield and Friess Lake residents and February 19th for non-residents. The online or paper registration form is due to either the Richfield or Friess Lake school district offices by June 7th.

Skyward Registration Instructions

- 1. Log into Skyward Family Access
- 2. Click on "Arena Scheduling" to choose classes (course codes are listed under the class column).
- 3. Click "Add" on desired courses.
- 4. Proceed to the "Fee Management" tab to process payment for your selected courses. Your place in the selected classes will not be secured until the fees have been processed through "Fee Management".
- 5. You will receive a confirmation email for each class your child has registered for.

New students must complete the "New Student Online Enrollment" in Skyward prior to registration. This is located on the front page of the district website. Please contact office at 262-628-1032 with questions.

Course Selection and Term Length

Courses will be filled according to the order in which registrations are received. In the Skyward system, families will be notified immediately if a class has reached capacity. Students completing the paper-and-pencil form will be notified if courses have reached capacity. The grade level indicated in each course refers to the grade students will enter in the 2018-19 school year. Each course runs for the full length of summer school, unless otherwise noted.

Fees and Payment

The fees for summer school are determined on a per student/per class basis. All students must pay fees for classes requiring additional materials as indicated in the course catalog. All fees must be paid in full in order to complete registration Payments can be made via the Skyward online portal or by check made out to the Richfield School District. All checks must be turned in to either school district office. All non-resident students, and those not opened enrolled to Richfield or Friess Lake school districts, must pay an additional \$30 fee. **Please select course code SS250 for the non-resident fee.**

Refunds

Refunds will only be issued in the event of a class cancellation. Registration changes must be made prior to June 7, 2018. No refunds will be made after June 7, 2018.

Transportation

Transportation to and from summer school will be offered to resident families through Go Riteway at a cost of \$125 per student for the entire summer school session. The buses will arrive at Richfield Elementary School at 8:00 am and depart the school at 12:00 pm. Transportation will not be provided for students enrolled in YMCA after school care. **Please select course code SS249 for transportation.**
